I. Purpose of the ACV Taskforce

The primary function of the ACV Taskforce is to take responsibility for furthering the discussion from the Fall 2017 [ACV workshop series](#) by identifying priorities and investigating implementation actions to prepare the greater Charlotte region for autonomous and connected vehicles. Primary focus will be:

- Assess the [Automated and Connected Vehicle \(ACV\) Roadmap, Actions to Prepare the Greater Charlotte Region](#) recommendations developed out of the greater Charlotte region’s Fall 2017 ACV Workshop series and identify key actions or steps that local governments, transportation planning organizations, and key stakeholders can begin acting on.
- Develop strategic and tactical action items for the Task Force that are both attainable in the near term and move identified steps flowing from the ACV Road Map forward.

II. Mission Statement

The mission of the ACV Taskforce is to identify and affirm immediate actions that can be implemented regionally, while directing investigation into long-term strategies (e.g.- research, resources, policy, etc.), to prepare our communities, region and organizations for autonomous and connected vehicles.

The ACV Taskforce will be made of local government, private sector, MPO/RPO staff and other stakeholder representative organizations.

9. Assist in implementation and education of the public, private industry, and public and elected officials
10. Maintain a focus on initiatives and recommendations that benefit the entire region; and
11. Present recommendations from the study at the end of the process to their individual organizations.

2. Effectively manage the scope, schedule, and process
3. Keep ACV Taskforce members informed of progress
4. Manage logistics for meetings; and
